Do I need to book tickets in advance?

Wat Pho & Wat Arun: not necessary.

How much does a full day in Bangkok cost?

Expect 1,200–2,500 THB depending on food, transport, and entrance fees. Add extra for a dinner cruise or rooftop bar.

Is Bangkok safe for tourists?

Yes, but stay alert in crowded places and watch your belongings. Use official taxis, Grab, or river boats.

Is one day enough to see Bangkok?

You can visit the most iconic sights — Grand Palace, Wat Pho, Wat Arun, and a night market — but expect a full, active day. For a deeper experience, 2–3 days are ideal.

What is the best way to move around Bangkok in one day?

Grab (ride-hailing), BTS Skytrain, MRT, and river boats are the fastest. Avoid taxis during rush hour because traffic is heavy

What should I wear to temples in Bangkok?

Shoulders and knees must be covered. No sleeveless tops, short shorts, or see-through clothing. Light cotton clothes are perfect in the heat.
